

Dear Fellow American:

Are you satisfied with the performance of President Bush and Congress?

Here at The Heritage Foundation, we've generally supported the President's policies. But we think he's made some critical mistakes, and we've been very open in telling him so.

We think conservatives in Congress went off the track in many areas when they were in the majority. And now that they're in the minority, they need to return to basic conservative principles in order to take an effective stand against the liberal majority.

Conservatives and Republicans have been hesitant to criticize President Bush and congressional conservatives in public – because we don't like to give ammunition to the radical Left. But you probably have a lot to say about what you think they are doing wrong, and what they need to do differently.

That's why we've prepared the enclosed <u>SURVEY FOR CONSERVATIVES AND REPUBLICANS ONLY</u>. It's your opportunity to tell President Bush and conservatives in Congress what you think about their policies, and what you think they need to do now.

We believe the surveys you see in the media are often inaccurate, because they don't ask the right questions.

For example, they tell us that a majority of Americans do not support the war in Iraq. But they don't tell us how many people want us to surrender, and how many want us to fight harder and develop a better strategy to win the war against radical Islamists. They don't tell us how many think eavesdropping on foreign suspects is a threat to our civil liberties, and how many think we should be doing more listening in.

This is your chance to weigh in on questions like that.

How do you think we should deal with illegal immigration? Is the government taking the war on Islamic terrorism seriously enough? What do you think about the enormous, pork-laden federal budget? Should the government promote traditional values?

This is not a random survey like a Gallup Poll. It is only for conservatives like you, because it's your voice that has not been heard, and it's your voice that President Bush and conservatives in Congress badly need to hear.

We will not release the results of this survey to the media. It is strictly for the eyes of the Bush administration and conservative members of Congress. We don't think CBS or *The New York Times* cares what you think. Neither do Harry Reid or Nancy Pelosi.

And we don't want them to use your opinions as ammunition to launch yet another attack

on President Bush and conservatives. We will release your survey to those people who should be trying to please you, and who need to know if you are upset with them - and why.

Every survey will be tabulated, and along with the results we will tell the White House and members of Congress how many people participated. This is why it is vitally important for you to return your survey, even if you do not fill out every question.

We want to know what your complaints are. And if you are satisfied with the way things are going, we want to know that too.

You might be discouraged because so many of our hopes are not being fulfilled. I'm here to tell you that we need to keep fighting. We need to tell our elected officials what they are doing wrong, and what we expect from them.

So please fill out your survey right away, and return it to me in the enclosed postage-paid envelope.

I am also requesting that you send a contribution to help The Heritage Foundation pay for this survey project, and for our work researching and promoting our conservative solutions to America's problems.

We need to reach as many conservatives as we can. We need to tabulate the surveys accurately, and prepare a good, readable report that the Bush administration and conservative members of Congress will pay attention to.

And we need to follow up to make sure they are doing something about the issues that are important to you.
